# **Admissions Policy**

## **2018/19**

This Admissions Policy relates to the School Admissions Code 2014 and the School Admission Appeal Code 2012 and shall be deemed to be references to the Stanford and Corringham Schools Trust comprising Gable Hall School, **Hassenbrook Academy** and Corringham Primary School. Gable Hall School will continue to have regard to the advice of Thurrock Local Authority Admissions (Education Department).

## **Process of application**

Gable Hall will use the following timetable for applications each year (exact dates within the months may vary from year to year) which, whenever possible, will fit in with the common timetable agreed by the Thurrock Admissions:

- **September-** Gable Hall School will publish information about the arrangements for admission, including over subscription criteria for the following September (i.e. publish in September 2017 for admission in September 2018). This will include details of open evenings and other opportunities for prospective pupils and their parents to visit the school.
- **October-** Gable Hall will provide opportunities for parents and pupils to visit the school.
- **October-** Closing date for application form;
- **December-March-** Applications considered by Local Authority
- **March-** Offers of places notified in writing to parents by the Local Authority.

This timetable reflects the practice in Thurrock Local Authority and is intended to secure a co-ordinated approach to admissions for parents and pupils. Gable Hall School will fit in with the co-ordinated admissions scheme for Thurrock Local Authority, when this is agreed.

## **Consideration of applications**

Gable Hall School will consider all applications for places. Where fewer than 272 applications are received, Gable Hall School will offer places to all those who have legitimately applied.

Notwithstanding the paragraph above, Gable Hall School may refuse admission to particular applicants in cases where fewer than the published admission number has applied. These are applicants who have been excluded from two or more other schools, and the ability to refuse admissions runs for a period of two years from the last exclusion. In all the circumstances described in this paragraph, however, the Secretary of State may direct Gable Hall School to admit such a pupil and that direction shall be binding on Gable Hall School.

## **Admissions to the school will be allocated in the following order of priority:**

- In September 2012 Gable Hall School was designated an Arts College specialising in the Performing Arts. Each year the school will admit up to ten per cent of its intake (27 pupils) according to aptitude in Art / Textiles, Music, Dance and Drama. The 10% will be allocated across the four specialist areas.
- Parents wishing to apply for one of the places listed above should acquire a further application form from the school. Pupils will be invited to a workshop and auditions on a Saturday morning (an alternative day will be available for applicants unable to make a Saturday). Selection will be made following this day. Further details of the selection process are available from the school.

- The number of intended admissions for the year commencing September 2018 will be 272. In the case of over-subscription, the following criteria will be applied in order:-
  - (a) Children who are in the care or interim care of a local authority pursuant to sections 31 and 38 of the Children's Act 1989, or children who are accommodated by a local authority pursuant to section 20 of the Children's Act 1989. This includes children who were in care but have since been adopted or become subject to a residence order or special guardianship order.
  - (b) Pupils who live with parents, guardians or carers, who are employees in the Stanford and Corringham Schools Trust, provided that the employee has been employed by the Trust for a minimum of two years at the date of application for admissions and/or recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage.
  - (c) Siblings living in existing priority admission area (catchment area) of Gable Hall School by distance, using straight line measurement, with pupils closest to the school being given higher priority (straight line measurement being from the front door of the home address to the school reception using a digital mapping system).

Pupils whose older siblings are currently attending Gable Hall School in years 7 to 10 and will continue to do so on the date of admission

For the purpose of allocating places, sibling means:

- Full sibling living at the same address as the applicant
  - Step sibling living at the same address as the applicant
  - Half sibling living at the same address as the applicant
  - Long term foster sibling living at the same address as the applicant
- (d) Pupils resident in the priority admissions area (catchment area) of Gable Hall School by distance, using straight line measurement, with pupils closest to the school being given higher priority (straight line measurement being from the front door of the home address to the school reception using a digital mapping system)
  - (e) Siblings living outside the existing priority admissions area for the school:
 

Pupils whose older siblings are currently attending Gable Hall in years 7 to 10 and will continue to do so on the date of admission
  - (f) Pupils attending Primary Schools under the Stanford and Corringham Trust
  - (g) Children of former pupils of Gable Hall. The former pupil must be able to satisfy the school that they were in attendance for 5 full years.

- (h) Other pupils by distance from the school (by straight line measurement as above) with those nearer being accorded the higher priority.
- (i) Notwithstanding the provision of points a – h above, the Secretary of State may direct Gable Hall to admit a named pupil to Gable Hall on application from the Local Authority.

- In the event of over subscription the School will maintain a waiting list. Pupils on the list will be ranked in order of priority for admissions irrespective of the date of application. Placement on the waiting list does not affect parents' right to appeal against an unsuccessful application.

## **Mid-Year Admissions and September Admissions for Year Groups other than Year 7**

Parents wishing to make an application for a place for their child should submit the appropriate form to the Local Authority (Thurrock Council).

In year admission start date for all year groups is 18<sup>th</sup> September.

### **Arrangements for Appeals Panel**

Parents have the right to appeal to an Independent Appeal Panel if they are dissatisfied with an admission decision. The Panel usually comprises three members, at least one of whom must be a Lay Member. Lay Members are people without personal experience in the management or provision of education in any school. There must also be an Independent Member who is experienced in education but not an employee of the Council or Admission Authority.

The third may be either a Lay or Independent Member.

The arrangement for appeals will be in line with the Code of Practice on School Admission Appeals, in force as at date.

Parents normally have 20 days to lodge an appeal if a place has not been offered at Gable Hall School

Parents wishing to appeal against an admissions decision by Gable Hall School should send notice of appeal to the Clerk to the Appeal Panel at the address given on the appeal form. If you intend to bring legal representation this should be made clear on the form. Other documents may be submitted in support of an appeal and should be lodged with the Clerk to the Appeal Panel not less than 7 days before the appeal hearing.

Parents will be given at least 2 weeks' notice of the appeal hearing. At least 7 day before the hearing Gable Hall School will provide the parents with written details as to why it has not been possible to allow their child admission. The Appeal Panel has the discretion to refuse to admit late evidence.

The Clerk of the Appeal Panel will usually communicate the decision within a day or two and will inform the parents of the outcome in writing usually within 14 days of the hearing.

In the case of an unsuccessful appeal, The Appeal Panel will give the parents their reasons for not upholding the appeal.

The Appeals Panel's decision is final and legally binding on all parties.

## **Annual Procedures for Determining Admission Arrangements**

### **Consultation**

Gable Hall School will consult each year (by 31<sup>st</sup> January) on its proposed admission arrangements and will have regard to the local admissions forum for the Thurrock area. It will consult with those parties defined in the School Admission Code published by the Department for Education. If there are no changes to proposed admission arrangements for Gable Hall, it will consult at least every seven years.

### **Determination and publication of admission arrangements**

Following consultation, Gable Hall School will consider comments made by those consulted and will then determine its admission arrangements by 28<sup>th</sup> February of the relevant year and notify those consulted what has been determined.

### **Publication of admission arrangements**

The published arrangements will set out:

- The name and address of the school and contact details;
- A summary of the admissions policy, including oversubscription criteria;
- Numbers of places and applications for those places in the previous year;
- Arrangements for hearing appeals.

### **Representations about admission arrangements**

Where other admissions authorities in the relevant area make representations to Gable Hall School about its admission arrangements, the school will consider such representations. Where Gable Hall School and other admission authorities cannot reach agreement locally, any admission authority in Thurrock may make representations to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State will consider the representations and in doing so will consult Gable Hall School. Where he judges it appropriate, the Secretary of State may direct Gable Hall School to amend its admission arrangements.

Other admission authorities in the Thurrock area have the right to ask Gable Hall School to increase its proposed published admissions number for any year. Where such a request is made, but agreement cannot be reached locally, an admission authority may ask to the Secretary of State to direct Gable Hall School to increase its proposed published admissions number. The Secretary of State will consult Gable Hall School and will then determine the published admission number.

In addition to the above provisions, the Secretary of State may direct changes to Gable Hall School's proposed admission arrangements and, in addition to the provisions above, the Secretary of State may direct changes to the proposed published admissions number.

### **Proposed changes to admission arrangements by Gable Hall School after arrangements have been published**

Once the admission arrangements have been determined and published, Gable Hall School will propose changes only if there is a major change of circumstances. In such cases, Gable Hall School must consult those consulted above and must then apply to the Secretary of State setting out:

- The proposed changes;
- Reasons for wishing to make such changes;
- Any comments or objections from those entitled to object.

### **Need to secure Secretary of State's approval for changes to admission arrangements**

The Secretary of State will consider applications from Gable Hall School to change its admission arrangements only when Gable Hall School has consulted on the proposed changes as outlined above.

Where Gable Hall School has consulted on proposed changes and there have been no objections from other admissions authorities Gable Hall School must still secure the agreement of the Secretary of State before any such changes can be implemented. Gable Hall School must seek the Secretary of State's approval in writing, setting out the reasons for the proposed changes and passing to him any comments or objections from other admission authorities/other persons.

The Secretary of State can approve, modify or reject proposals from Gable Hall School to change its admission arrangements.

Records of applications and admissions shall be kept by the Stanford and Corringham School's Trust for a minimum period of 10 years and shall be open for inspection by the Secretary of State.
